

## Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde: Writing Exercise 1 (English Lit) — Writing to persuade

Read the following passage from Act 1 of the play. Jekyll is talking to his sister Katherine, who has recently taken up photography as a hobby. They have been looking at a photograph Katherine has taken of her children, Lucy and Charles.

**KATHERINE** ... What do you think?

**JEKYLL** It's - a very touching composition.

Well, I hope it's more than touching. It was intended to be KATHERINE

**JEKYLL** You think one sees the truth of people in their faces?

KATHERINE Why else look into the mirror?

**JEKYLL** Well, I'd have thought, to see the opposite. Surely it's

- Do you gree with Katherine, or with Jekyll? Write a piece which persuades your reader of your point of view. Remember to use a range of techniques. You could include:
  - Opinion present your personal viewpoint as if it is fact
  - Examples to back up your opinion
  - Emotive language
  - Rhetorical questions
  - Flattery
  - Facts and figures
- Think about how Katherine and Jekyll's views might be relevant to modern life, as well as their own time.
